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The Old Rectory is a fifteen bed care home situated in just under one acre of land. The Old Rectory cares and supports people with learning disabilities, autism and other associated complex health, behavioural and emotional needs.



The Old Rectory is divided into three four bedroom apartments and one three bedroom apartment, each providing care and support. Each person has their own bedroom with ensuite facilities, a shared lounge, dining room and kitchen facilities. There is a large private garden.

The Old Rectory has been a care home since 1984, with the aim to provide accommodation for people with Learning Disabilities, Autism, and other associated complex health, emotional and behavioural needs. Service users are encouraged and enabled to lead a fulfilled and independent life with the necessary support.

We provide support to promote inclusion within the local community, access to the local amenities, lifelong learning experiences and leisure pursuits.

We have many years experience responding to the needs, aspirations and choice of each individual, which enables service users to build and maintain rewarding relationships leading to be a valued member of their community.

### **Sensory Stimulation/Complementary Therapies:**



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### **Our Vision**

We provide bespoke specialist accommodation to adults with Learning Disabilities, Autism and other associated complex health, emotional and behavioural needs.

The Old Rectory aims to provide inclusion, human and civil rights and equality in it's work. We offer services to people sensitive to their disability, curial, religious, racial and sexual orientation.

The building comprises of three self contained four bedroom apartments, and one three bedroom apartment. All bedrooms are of a generous size and have en-suite facilities, some with showers, some with a bath. We also offer specially adapted shower/bath facilities. Rooms are decorated to the individuals taste and style. In addition each apartment has a spacious lounge, kitchen/diner or dining room and safe outside garden area.

### **Team Work**

Our specialist service is provided by a highly trained and dedicated staff team. Their professional expertise is in Autistic Spectrum Disorder, Learning Disabilities and other associated complex needs, is drawn from varied backgrounds, hence creating a team with a wealth of knowledge, skills and experience in supporting those who have disabilities.


## QUALITY
